THE SEASON OF ADVENT

The Meaning of Advent

Advent, a season of four Sundays, begins the church year. The season begins on the Sunday closest to November 30. This year our first Sunday in Advent is December 1.

The word, Advent, consists of two Latin words: ad - venire, "To come to." Advent's message is that God in Christ is coming to the world. This coming may be:

- A past experience. God did come in Christ at Christmas. The prophets' promise was fulfilled in the Babe.
- A present experience. God may come to you this Christmas in terms of re-birth, either for the first time, or a renewed birth in deeper understanding of the Gospel.
- A future experience. Christ will return unpredictably at the end of the world. "He shall come again with glory to judge the quick and the dead." Since Advent promises the sure coming of the Lord, its message is "prepare." The Lord is coming whether the world is ready or not.

To help our congregation experience the blessings of this season we will have expanded opportunities to learn more about the Advent of our King through a series of Sunday Worship Services and Bible

studies entitled:

"Prophecies and Promises: Made and Fulfilled"

CHRIST said, "Search the Scriptures. They testify of me!" (John 5:39)

WHERE? HOW? WHY?

The Old Testament was the only Bible of the early Christians. Where did they find Christ in it? What about the Old Testament people? Were they saved without a knowledge of Jesus Christ?

THESE questions (and more) will be considered in our Sunday Worship Services and and Bible studies during Advent as well as our special Christmas Worship Services.

Advent Midweek

In addition to our regular Sunday morning worship service and Bible study, we will have three midweek Advent services on Wednesday evenings in December. These will begin with a meal at 5:30 pm, followed by a Service at 7:00 pm. Between the meal and the Service we will have a Servant Event – making plates of Christmas baking for our shut ins and for the young people at the Cyrus Center Youth Shelter. Please bring some goodies to share with them when you attend the first two Advent services (December 4 and 11). On December 18 we will have our congregational Christmas Potluck Supper prior to the final Advent midweek service.

Holidays can be difficult GriefShare can help!


