"BE PREPARED"

The Bible often talks about "p" words. Be prepared, be patient, be persistent, be preaching (proclaiming), be praying, be providing an example, etc. The task described in 2 Timothy is important for pastors and

regret. Here is what we want and need to take to heart: This I call to mind, and therefore I have hope: The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your

congregations to remember as we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, on whom our faith depends from beginning to end. He did not give up because of the cross! On the contrary, because of the joy

that was waiting for him, he thought nothing of the disgrace of dying on the cross, and he is now seated at the right side of God's throne (Hebrews 12:2).

As September slides into fall we begin to think about being prepared for what lies ahead: elections, Thanksgiving, Halloween (Reformation), time change, even Christmas (if you have been to Costco recently) and no doubt some birthdays and other family events too. The logic is: if we prepare early, the holiday or event will be more relaxing and enjoyable. Then there may be other life events we are less prepared for: changes in health, the need to move, relocation of relatives, even the loss of a pet, etc. It is impossible for us to be prepared for everything.

Impossible that is—unless we remember who orders and guides our days. The standard Old Testament reading for Thanksgiving is found in the middle of a lament, a song of sadness and

Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. (2 Timothy 4:2) faithfulness. "The LORD is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him." The LORD is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him. . . For the Lord will not cast

off forever, but, though he cause grief, he will have compassion according to the abundance of his steadfast love. (Lamentations 3)

In other words, we may not be prepared for every event and eventuality in life, but God is. And He asks us to be patient, prayerful and prepared to follow His guidance, whether awaiting a holiday or something more profound like a new pastor. Kingdom work, and our role in it continues.

So be prepared to serve as the Lord has gifted you and as your family of faith at St. Paul's asks you, because: there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. (1 Corinthians 12)


This week, we pray for **Rev. Walta Clercius** who serves as Assistant Missionary-at-Large for LCC's French Ministries in Quebec.
